### **Study of Predisposing, Enabling, Reinforcing Factors in Teenagers Groups in Complying with Covid-19 Health Protocols Regarding the Use of Masks, Maintaining Distance, and Washing Hands with Soap**

Community compliance in implementing health protocols is the main key in handling the Covid-19 pandemic. Teenagers have an important role in the successful handling of this pandemic. Because they have a stronger immune system than other ages. This study aims to figure the Predisposing, Enabling, Reinforcing factors in the teenagers group in complying with the Covid-19 health protocol related to the use of masks, maintaining distance, and washing hands with soap in Magetan sub-district.

This research is a descriptive research with survey method. Population in this study was all teenagers aged 15-19 years in Magetan District. The site selection method was carried out using C-Survey 2.0, obtained four locations as research points with the proportion of 292 respondents.

Based on the results of the study showed that the level of compliance of teenagers in complying with health protocols (100%) did not comply. In terms of predisposing factors consist of good knowledge (69.9%), good attitude (64.7%), actions to use masks (31.2%), actions to keep distance (0%). Enabling factors include the level of adequacy of masks and signs in the community that are already available. However, some people do not apply hand washing (51.0%). Meanwhile, the reinforcing cause shows that there are appeals (100%), prohibitions (22.6%), warnings (18.8%), and no sanctions for violators (100%).

Violations occur due to weak law enforcement given. Therefore, it is necessary to impose sanctions and fines for violators. So that community discipline in implementing health protocols becomes better.
